



Tempe Tourism Office Coronavirus (COVID-19) Update

The Tempe Tourism Office team is closely monitoring the news and updates as related to COVID-19.

The [Arizona Department of Health Services](#) has reported that the Arizona level of community spread for COVID-19 is minimal. The number of cases in Arizona is very low but we are still taking precautions. Earlier this week, Governor Doug Ducey declared a state of emergency which will allow Arizona to utilize emergency funding, assist with the distribution of medical supplies to healthcare professionals and help prevent the spread of this disease.

There are currently no travel restrictions for Arizona or the United States.

In compliance with the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) recommendations to practice social distancing, the City of Tempe has **cancelled all public special events through the end of April**. This includes all Cactus League Spring Training games. You can read their statement on the [City of Tempe website](#). The hope is that pausing these public gatherings will minimize the spread of this virus and protect the health of our residents and visitors. The city's website also includes a [list of cancelled events](#) which may continue to evolve, so please review the list frequently.

We are currently updating our website to indicate the events that have been cancelled. If you are planning to visit Tempe for a specific event or meeting, please contact the event organizers ahead of time to confirm if it is still being held or if it has been cancelled or postponed.
